## December Fire Takes Three Lives in Washougal

A December 7th fire in Washougal took the lives of three people and required the coordination of firefighters from Washougal, Camas, ECFR, and dozens of police and S.W.A.T. officers. The occupant began shooting at initial fire and police responders, who thought they were enroute to a "standard" house fire. All personnel were pulled back to a safe distance while the scene was turned over to law enforcement for several hours. Thankfully no responders or bystanders were seriously injured. Unfortunately further investigation found that three occupants perished in the ensuing fire.

Dozens of firefighters and community members helped package and deliver over 66,000 pounds of food and donated gifts to 176 needy families throughout Washougal, Camas, and the area served by East County Fire and Rescue. ## Firefighter Deaths Trend Downward

The United States Fire Administration has released preliminary firefighter line of duty death statistics for 2011. The 81 LODDs in 2011 represented a 7% decrease over 2010. Heart attacks remains the number one cause of loss of life at 59% of all fatalities. Only three firefighters died from vehicle collisions, which may be representative of the added emphasis on safe driving practices over the past several years. The breakdown of the 2011 LODDs:
