As such, the attached scope of work only includes the first few tasks of the envisioned full project need to allow the team to review and confirm existing data prepared to date, discuss conceptual alternatives and fully vet the comprehensive project scope before proceeding. Staff anticipates coming back to Council to request an amendment to the contract as the initial tasks near completion. This item was discussed at the July 21, 2014, Council Workshop. ## B. Miscellaneous and Scheduling

Details: Updates on miscellaneous or scheduling items.

Department/Presenter: Pete Capell, City Administrator

1. Crown Park Pool - Capell noted that with the recent decision about Lacamas Swim and Sport, staff has asked for direction about the next steps for the Crown Park Pool. Jerry Acheson, Parks and Recreation Manager, received a budget estimate of \$1.8 million to renovate the pool, including bathrooms that could be available for the Park. The debt service would be approximately \$115,000 annually.

Capell concluded from Council's comments that they would like to review a more developed pool concept and receive vetting from the public.

2. Oak Park Community Center - Capell asked Council if they wanted to update the Oak Park Community Center. The update would include paint, carpet, windows, a kitchen upgrade and other general improvements to better utilize the facility. The budget for the update would be approximately \$500,000 and debt service would be approximately \$32,000 per year.

Turk suggested that the update improvements come out of the capital budget rather than the bond. Council expressed interest in determining where this facility fit in to the vision of the strategic plan that is being formed. Capell noted that individual Council members and Community leaders will be invited to attend a strategic planning meeting later this month where this subject will be discussed.

- 3. CWEDA Update The consultants have finished Phase II of the New Market Tax Credit (NMTC) work. The application from the Community Development Entity (CDE) for tax credits is due October 1st. Steve Hogan sits on the board of the CDE. The Camas project would be a downtown redevelopment project with retail on the ground floor and residential on the upper floors. The NMTC, plus the proposed Multi-Family Tax Exemption Program, could make this a viable project in the near future. CWEDA members previously suggested a joint work shop and Council concurred that an acceptable date is the October 20th Workshop. An update about current activities will be given to all of the partner agencies during the meeting.
- 4. Strategic Plan A staff committee has been developing a draft Strategic Plan. Capell will be setting up meetings with the Mayor, Council and community leaders to receive input and feedback for the development of the Strategic Plan.

#### VI. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

A. Change Order No. 2 for Project WS-714 and WS-729 STEP Sewer Main and Relocate Waterline for Burlington Northern Santé Fe (BNSF) Rail Road

Details: Change Order No. 2 for Project WS-714 and WS-729 is for a total of \$6,675.40 in additional costs related to excavation around an unmarked utility, overtime pay when required work was limited to an evening and weekend day, costs associated with a change in length of a casing pipe, and additional piping materials required to complete the work. The final project cost will be about \$15,000 less than the original bid, due to some quantity reductions. Feedback about the concept was requested because any action this year involving amendments to the Comprehensive Plan will need to be submitted, scheduled and acted upon.

RE: Change Order (CO) #2 for Project WS-714/WS-729 BNSF Casing Project

This memo provides information related to Change Order #2 for Projects: WS-714 & WS-729 - The STEP Main Sewer Casing and Relocated Water Casing under the BNSF Railroad Tracks. Each of these are components from two separate projects that have been combined into one construction contract. The Total Bid for these projects is \$690,809.35.

#### **Budget and Expenditure Summary**

- WS-714 STEP Sewer Transmission Main The current project (The 48" Casing) amounts to about \$350,000 and is a small portion of the overall estimated \$4.4 million project funded primarily by a \$3,740,000 PWTF Loan. The remaining funds for the overall project are expected to come from the Sewer Utility Fund. The current project (The 48" Casing) amounts to about \$350,000.
- WS-729 Waterline Casing Relocation for BNSF Bridge \$150,000 was initially budgeted for this project in the adopted 2014 Budget. The current amended Budget is \$370,000, which is more in line with the amount of the successful low bid of \$357,000, for this work. The total cost of this project will be funded by the Water Utility Fund.

#### **Change Order Summary**

CO#2 consists of seven items totaling \$ 6,675.40 including sales tax. Of this total, \$ 10,517.29 is for work on WS-714, and a Credit of \$ 4,359.17 is for work related to WS-729.

All work on the project is now complete and the final total project cost will be about \$14,800 below the initial bid of \$690,809.35. The cost reduction is due to a decrease in the casing length actually installed, and a reduction of approximately \$10,000 in obstruction removal costs; amounting to a savings of about 2% from the original bid.

Community Development staff will be available to respond to any questions.

Dear Mr. Wall:

We are pleased to have the opportunity to submit the following proposal to the City of Camas (City) for initial professional engineering services for the North Urban Growth Area (NUGA) Sewer Service Alternatives Analysis project. The project has a constricted schedule; the City's preference is for full project completion by early January 2015. This initial scope of services represents some initial project tasks, and will allow for our commencement of engineering work in advance of the full project scope development. Full project scope development will be completed concurrently with completion of the scope of work described herein, and will be described in another proposal.

#### **SCOPE OF WORK**

#### Task 1: Project Management

This task includes budget and scope monitoring, internal meetings, internal staff scheduling, communications with the City, and invoicing. The task also includes the establishment of a quality assurance/quality control (QA/QC) plan and its implementation during the analysis process.

Task 1 Fee: \$1,435

#### Task 2: General Sewer Plan Confirmation

Work completed under this task will include confirmation of the delineated basins shown in the City's General Sewer Plan (GSP). As part of this initial work, we will verify the basins that will be served by the proposed sewer improvements, and confirm the ultimate basin flows that will provide the basis for future design and cost estimating. We will provide a draft memorandum summarizing our work completed under this task. A final memorandum will be included as part of the full scope of services prepared later.

#### **Task 3: Sewer Alignment Alternatives**

The initial work to be completed for the sewer alternatives analysis will be a meeting with City staff and the BergerABAM engineering design team. This meeting will begin the full alternatives analysis processes, and will allow our staff to develop a full understanding of the various ideas and preferences the City may have with respect to sewer alignment alternatives. The meeting will also include a discussion of constraints associated with alignments already considered, and will provide a venue for brainstorming of alignment options and constraints not yet considered. We request that City planning staff, in addition to engineering staff, attend this meeting to help us develop a full understanding of proposed developments in terms of size, timing, and stakeholders.

Task 3 Fee: \$3,292

#### Task 4: Development Coordination

There are a number of proposed land use developments within the NUGA project area that are currently in various stages of design. BergerABAM will coordinate with these developers/developments and review current proposals to verify and evaluate assumptions of the anticipated sewer flows and costs to provide service for these projects. We will summarize our work in a memorandum, which will provide overview of land use activities and anticipated capital needs associated with the NUGA project.

Task 4 Fee: \$4,735

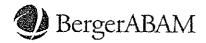

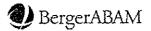

#### STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS

#### BILLINGS

Lump-sum jobs are billed according to agreed-upon milestones, on a percent-of-completion basis. Time and expense jobs are invoiced in accordance with the labor and other costs incurred in performing the work. Personnel are billed at a rate that includes labor overhead and an allowance for profit. Project-related expenses are billed at cost or use rate plus 10 percent (10%).

#### **PAYMENT SCHEDULE**

Invoices are submitted monthly for services performed during the prior month and are due upon receipt. If Client fails to make any payment due BergerABAM for services and expenses within thirty (30) days after receipt of BergerABAM's statement therefore, the amounts due shall bear interest, at the prevailing legal rate from said thirtieth day. In addition, BergerABAM may, after giving seven (7) days written notice to Client, suspend services under this Agreement until BergerABAM has been paid in full all amounts due for services, expenses, and charges. Attorneys' fees and other costs incurred in collecting a delinquent amount will also be charged. Late or nonpayment of fees is cause for immediate termination by BergerABAM.

#### **CHANGED CONDITIONS**

Should conditions of the work change so as to materially affect the level of effort or the time required, then equitable adjustments to fee and schedule shall be made. BergerABAM will notify Client when a changed condition becomes apparent. Failure of Client to provide a timely and equitable adjustment is cause for termination by BergerABAM.

In the event that government jurisdictions, at any level, legislate new taxes or administratively interpret existing regulations such that additional taxes apply to this work, this shall be cause for an equitable adjustment of the contract fee in recognition of the increased taxation.

#### **TERMINATION**

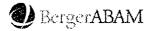
Either Client or BergerABAM may terminate this contract at any time, upon fourteen (14) days written notice in the event of substantial failure by the other party to perform in accordance with the terms hereof through no fault of the terminating party.

In the event of termination of this Agreement, BergerABAM shall be paid for all services rendered up to the date of termination, and shall be paid for all unpaid Additional Services and unpaid Reimbursable Expenses incurred up to the date of termination, and shall be paid for all termination expenses. #### **PROJECT RELATIONS**

BergerABAM shall not direct or supervise Contractor or other third parties and will not act as Client's agent. Contractor and/or Client is solely responsible for the means and methods of construction, including job-site safety. BergerABAM is responsible solely for the negligent acts

and omissions of its own employees, agents, and subconsultants. BergerABAM is not responsible for the negligent acts or omissions of others, against which Client will defend and indemnify BergerABAM.

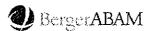
#### BergerABAM PERSONNEL AT CONSTRUCTION SITE

The presence of BergerABAM personnel at a construction site, whether as on-site representatives or otherwise, shall not make BergerABAM in any way responsible for those duties that belong to the Client and/or the Construction Contractors or other entities, and does not relieve the Construction Contractors or any other entities of their obligations, duties, and responsibilities, including, but not limited to, all construction methods, means, techniques, sequences, and procedures necessary for coordinating all portions of the construction work in accordance with the contract documents, and any health or safety precautions required by the work.

BergerABAM's site responsibilities are limited solely to the activities of BergerABAM and BergerABAM employees on site. These responsibilities shall not be inferred by any party to mean that BergerABAM has responsibility for site safety. Safety in, on, or about the site is the sole and exclusive responsibility of the contractor alone. The contractor's methods of work performance, techniques, superintendence of the contractor's employees, sequencing of construction, and procedures necessary for coordinating all portions of the construction work in accordance with the contract documents are also the sole and exclusive responsibilities of the contractor alone.

Client warrants that: 1) the Construction Contractor's responsibilities will be made clear in Client's agreement with the Contractor; 2) Client's agreement with the Contractor shall require the Contractor to indemnify, defend, and hold Client and BergerABAM harmless from any claim or liability for injury or loss arising from Client's or BergerABAM's alleged failure to exercise site safety responsibility; and 3) Client's agreement with the Contractor shall require the Contractor to make Client and BergerABAM additional insureds under the contractor's general liability insurance policy, which insurance protection shall be primary protection for Client and BergerABAM.

Given the foregoing, Client also shall, to the fullest extent permitted by law, waive any claim against BergerABAM and indemnify, defend, and hold BergerABAM harmless from any claim or liability for injury or loss arising from BergerABAM's alleged failure to exercise site safety responsibility. Client also shall compensate BergerABAM for any time spent or expenses incurred by BergerABAM in defense of any such claim. Such compensation shall be based upon BergerABAM's prevailing fee schedule and expense reimbursement policy. (The term "any claim" used in this provision means "any claim in contract, tort, or statute alleging negligence, errors, omissions, strict liability, statutory liability, breach of contract, breach of warranty, negligent misrepresentation, or other acts giving rise to liability.")



#### SUPPORTING SUBCONSULTANTS

BergerABAM works on a continuing basis with a group of selected specialized subconsultants as required to balance peak staffing requirements and provide specialized expertise for scheduled workload. BergerABAM reserves the right to make assignments to these firms, including, but not limited to, routine word processing, drafting, civil and structural engineering, and environmental work. Work by these firms is performed under the oversight of the BergerABAM project manager and is subject to BergerABAM quality review. Services performed by subconsultants will be billed to client by BergerABAM at actual costs plus 10 percent (10%). If requested, BergerABAM will make information on collaborating subconsultants available for client review.

BergerABAM reserves the right to supplement in-house project staff with loaned employees from The Louis Berger Group, Inc. Unless otherwise specifically defined, any added costs associated with the use of these employees will be handled internal to BergerABAM and clients will be charged at BergerABAM standard rates for the grade and/or skill level of employees involved.

#### **USE OF OWNER-SPECIFIED CONSULTANTS OR CONTRACTORS**

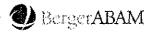

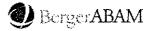

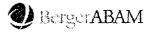
#### LIABILITY

#### DISPUTES

Should a dispute arise, Client will continue to pay BergerABAM's regular invoices. No offset or deduction will be made. Every effort will be made to resolve the dispute as expeditiously as possible. First, the parties will attempt to resolve the matter directly. Failing this, the matter will be submitted for mediation, which will be conducted in a manner mutually acceptable. The cost of mediation will be borne equally by the parties. If mediation is not successful, the dispute will be resolved in a court of competent jurisdiction. The venue will be federal or state court, located in King County, Washington.

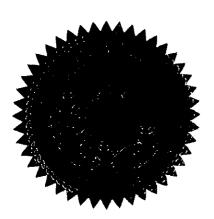
